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About DRI Membership

DRI operates on a membership model; the first step to depositing data is becoming a member of DRI.

What are the benefits of membership?

- Preservation of data by DRI (up to certain storage constraints) until the project completion date.
- Publication and dissemination (as appropriate) of data facilitated by DRI until project completion date.
- Provision of search across all collections within DRI.
- Provision of tools for visualising and analysing data.
- Priority access to DRI training courses and workshops.
- Note that benefits, including ongoing preservation, extend only for periods of active membership.

What are the obligations of membership? Members must:

- Ensure that digital objects deposited meet the Repository's documented standards (including but not limited to those pertaining to licensing, metadata and formats).
- Abide by all DRI agreements (e.g. Organisational Manager Agreement, Deposit Agreements).

Who is eligible for membership?

- Eligible Organisations include: Research Performing Organisations, institutions, organisations and digital archives who hold humanities and social science data.
- Other interested parties should contact DRI.
